Housing update in Town Centre and The Parks

The keys for affordable housing at Coopers Hill were handed to the council. The development includes homes for private sale and 13 affordable homes managed by Abri. More homes are being built and refurbished across the borough, reducing the housing waiting list by 10%. With 1743 local households still on the waiting list, new developments on the unused land at the old council depot and Bracknell Beeches will be welcome.

Bracknell Forest Council has been lucky enough to secure a grant from the Better Care Fund to run a project focused on community health and wellbeing. Based on local health data, the Town Centre part of our ward has been identified to pilot this Thriving Communities Programme. Many people come to the town centre for work. shopping or leisure.
